7. TOWN CLERK AND RESPONSIBLE FINANCIAL OFFICER'S REPORT.

7.1 TREE FELLED - STORM EUNICE (p).

Unfortunately, a large Cedar in Swanscombe Park was badly damaged during Storm Eunice (18 February). A tree consultant was asked to investigate the damage and it was recommended, for the reasons contained in the attached report, that the tree be felled.

In consultation with the Town Mayor and Chairman of Recreation, Leisure and Amenities Committee it was agreed for this to be undertaken and that x2 replacement trees would be sourced and planted in Swanscombe Park.

Attached for members information are:

- The relevant extract from the previous tree survey
- An explanation as to why the felling was required
- Photos showing the extensive damage that the tree had.

DBC granted permission for the 5-day notice and the tree was scheduled and removed on 8 March 2022.

7.4 FOOTBALL PITCH CONDITION REVIEW.

Due to the current usage of our pitches, we would like to look at the condition of the pitches with the Senior Groundsman/Gardener at the culmination of the 2021 – 2022 season. This will then help us to decide whether we need to look at reducing or limiting the amount of games played on each pitch.

The plan would be to bring this back to the Recreation, Leisure and Amenities Committee in late 2022.

Nb. The Recreation, Leisure and Amenities Committee previously (24 June 2021) placed a limit of 28 teams across all our pitches

7.5 ALLSTAR ECOPOINT SCHEME (p).

We have received this year's certificate confirming we have contributed 11 trees in 2021. This brings the Town Councils total, since joining the Scheme, to 104 trees.
