OBSERVATIONS:	The Town Council note that similar applications for this site have previously been refused or withdrawn (14/01035/OUT, 20/00565/FUL). The Town Council objects to the application as it is an overdevelopment of the site which is not compatible with surrounding developments. This proposal would have adverse effects on nearby existing properties. There are concerns that the parking provisions contained in the proposal do not meet the requirements/standards of the Planning Authority and would be insufficient for all residents and visitors which will result in excess vehicles parking in adjacent roads that already suffer with serious parking issues. The proposed access/egress points are not suitable as these are already busy roads (for the train station) and especially at peak times when drop offs and pickups occur. Further traffic in this area will make it dangerous and more difficult for the users of the roads in this area.
	The Town Council strongly urge that the applicant must take into account, and include mitigating provisions regarding the environmental impact on, and the needs of, the community for their development and, where possible, include the provision of Electric Vehicle Charging Points. It is not felt that the benefits of developing this site for high density housing would be outweighed by the disbenefits.
