OBSERVATIONS:

The Town Council object to this application on the following grounds:-

It is disappointing that there is an application for demolition without any assessment of historic/archaeological interest of the buildings and the site (including below ground). Members seek clarification as to the protection of any underground parts of the buildings if these were to have historic/archaeological value.

The Programme of Works supplied with the application is completely out of date to such a degree that it is now meaningless.

The Bat Survey provided with the application (June 21017)includes under recommendation 4 that the site should work to enhance the area for bats, principally by providing roosts but there does not seem to be any evidence within the application that the developer is going to take any action to enhance this provision?

There does not appear to have been any reptile or amphibian survey undertaken by the applicant.

Under Question 13 (Impact on Wildlife) of the survey included in the application the applicant has ticked No as an answer in all the boxes. This is clearly not accurate as the Town Council is aware of the existence of amphibians, and probably reptiles, on the site as these are already known to inhabit the Swanscombe Heritage Park which is adjacent to the site. The Town Council would request that a full survey is undertaken on the site.

Hedge rows are protected and have the potential to be biodiversity assets and as such confirmation/clarification is sought that the application has taken this into account and adheres to any/all required legislation in this regard.

A2 Bean and Ebbsfleet Junction improvement scheme Statutory pre-application consultation between 21 February 2018 and 4 April 2018 Planning Act 2008 section 42: Duty to consult about a proposed application

I am writing with reference to the A2 Bean and Ebbsfleet Junction improvement scheme. This is to notify you that Highways England is proposing to make an application to the Secretary of State for a Development Consent Order (DCO) for this scheme under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 ("the Act"). We will be undertaking statutory pre-application consultations from 21 February 2018 until 4 April 2018. In accordance with the Act Highways England, as the prospective applicant, must consult with you about this proposed application. This is because our enquiries indicate that you may own, lease, occupy or have an interest or right in the land that could be affected or may be affected as a result of the proposed scheme being implemented.

About the proposed scheme and the development consent order process

In summary, the proposed scheme will involve proposals which include retention of the existing layout at Bean Junction, enlargement of the current roundabouts and addition of traffic light controls at both. Additionally, proposed measures include the addition of a new bridge over the A2 for southbound traffic (situated to the east of the existing Bean Lane over bridge, to be retained for northbound traffic) and a new slip road on to the A2 for eastbound traffic. The Ebbsfleet Junction proposals will broadly follow the existing road layout also, with enlargement of the roundabouts and inclusion of traffic light controls also. The road between the two roundabouts will be widened to a dual carriageway, the slip roads from the A2 are to be retained and the slip roads onto the A2 widened. A preferred route announcement for the scheme was made in August 2017.

The scheme meets the thresholds for a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project as defined in the Act. As a result we are required to submit an application for a DCO to the Secretary of State for Transport through the Planning Inspectorate (PINS). Information about the Act, the DCO process and the role of PINS can be found on the PINS website: http://infrastructure.planninginspectorate.gov.uk.

To facilitate construction of the proposed scheme, our DCO application may need to seek powers for the compulsory acquisition of land and/or rights over land. This statutory



consultation is therefore an important opportunity for you to have your say. We strongly encourage you to provide your feedback to us now through this consultation process before our proposals are finalised and submitted to the Planning Inspectorate for examination.

We have commissioned a specialist land referencing company called TerraQuest to identify and confirm all relevant land interests that may potentially be affected. As part of that exercise, you should have already received or will receive shortly a questionnaire from TerraQuest asking you to confirm your interests and providing you with plans showing what we believe to be the extent of your interests and the land which might be affected. If you require any further assistance with the land interest questionnaire, please do get in touch with TerraQuest on Freephone 0800 902 0421. Please note that TerraQuest's land referencing enquiries are separate from this consultation process. If you do have any concerns about the proposed scheme and the effects it may have on you or your land interests we encourage you to submit them to us now in response to this consultation. This will enable us to take your views into account in developing and refining our scheme designs.

The Application is for the proposed A2 Bean and Ebbsfleet junction improvements scheme, located within the administrative areas of Kent County Council, Dartford Borough Council and Gravesend Borough Council.

The proposed scheme is needed to reduce congestion, improve safety and support planned growth. In summary:

- At Bean junction the existing layout will be retained with the current roundabouts enlarged and controlled by traffic lights. There will be a new bridge over the A2 for southbound traffic (situated to the east of the existing Bean Lane overbridge, which will be retained for northbound traffic) and a new slip road on to the A2 for eastbound traffic.
- At Ebbsfleet junction the proposals broadly follow the existing road layout with enlarged roundabouts controlled by traffic lights, the road between the roundabouts will be widened to a dual carriageway, slip roads to the A2 will be widened and slip roads from the A2 will be retained. A comprehensive package of environmental mitigation and compensation measures is proposed.

Consultation on the proposals will take place from Wednesday 21 February until 23:45 on Wednesday 4 April 2018.

Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR)

The scheme is an Environmental Impact Assessment development ("EIA development"), as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works constitute development for which an Environmental Impact Assessment will be required. An Environmental Statement will therefore be submitted as part of the application. Preliminary Environmental Information ("PEIR") will be published as part of the consultation materials.
