PARKS REPORT RLA – 21 SEPTEMBER 2017

The programme of Children's Summer Entertainment put on by the council throughout the school holidays this year was very popular and well attended.

• Swanscombe Park:

We have had problems with the bowls green playing surface this season. The green never fully recovered from disease infestation during the winter months and has not looked at its best although staff have worked hard to achieve an acceptable playing surface. Hopefully the autumn renovation work at the end of the season will result in an improved surface next year.

Shrub and tree pruning is underway.

Manor Park:

Shrub and tree pruning will be undertaken during the autumn.

Broomfield:

Another cricket season has ended and the cricket square has stood up well throughout. Swanscombe and Greenhithe 1880 Cricket Club won their league this year and have written to the council to thank the parks staff for their efforts in producing excellent wickets. Autumn renovations to the cricket square are due to take place.

The free open air cinema screening at the end of August was well attended and a great success.

Two of the concrete fence posts on the perimeter of the park have been replaced. All football pitches have been measured, squared up and marked out and the football season is underway.

The Japanese Knotweed that was creeping over our boundary from a neighbouring property seems to have been dealt with by the property owner, staff will continue to monitor the situation.

The damaged mesh on tone of the kissing gates has been repaired by a contractor.

Knockhall:

The first free open air cinema screening event in early August was extremely popular and very well attended.

Work to replace the slide on the junior multiplay unit has been completed by contractors.

The Parks Staff have replaced a broken gate spring.

Both football pitches have been measured, squared up and marked and have already been in use for a month.

The changing rooms are due to be deep/steam cleaned by a contractor and the paintwork will be freshened up by the Parks Staff

Issues with the new swing set have been resolved by the installers.

PARKS REPORT RLA – 21 SEPTEMBER 2017

Heritage Park:

A post supporting the rolling log section of the play equipment has been broken by ASB and we are awaiting its replacement by contractors.

Reports of motorbike nuisance have dropped off over the summer months.

Saxon Court:

Issues with the new swing set have been resolved by the installers. Trees and shrubs will be pruned over the coming weeks.

• Valley View:

Trees and shrubs will be pruned as part of our autumn/winter schedule.

Equipment:

Both vans are due for service in October.

Staff

Unfortunately Employee 7 was required to undertake 2 weeks (10 days) of jury service during July 2017 and Employee 63 was absent due to ill health for 14 days during August 2017.

Nb.

To minimize the negative impact these absences had on the work schedule a contractor was used to undertake the daily site checks and litter picks during these periods as well as assist with the bowls green preparation.

EXTRACT OF MINUTES

78/17-18. BENCHES IN PARKS/PLAY AREAS.

Members considered the installation of additional benches at the Swanscombe Heritage Park and also a bench at Valley View Play Area, Greenhithe as this was the only play area that did not currently have a bench in it.

After discussion it was agreed the Friends of the Heritage Park should be consulted for their views on the location of x2 new traditional benches in the Swanscombe Heritage Park (football training area).

It was also agreed that the current yellow metal bench in Broomfield Park, Swanscombe should be replaced and that the ATC/RFO should submit a funding application to the Kent County Council Members Grant Scheme for this replacement bench and the new traditional bench at Valley View, Greenhithe.

Recommended:

- 1. That, after consultation with the Friends of the Heritage Park, x2 traditional benches be installed at the Swanscombe Heritage Park and these be located around the edge of the football training area.
- 2. That a traditional bench be installed at Valley View Play Area, Greenhithe.
- 3. That a traditional bench replace the old yellow metal bench in Broomfield Park, Swanscombe.

Leisure Center

A large section of the small wooden fence around the Leisure Centre was damaged by ASB in January. Members are asked to consider whether they wish the parks staff to replace this fencing or leave it as it currently is.

Spring Vale

Fly tipping has taken place in the area adjacent to the builder's yard and has been reported to DBC.

Valley View

The work highlighted from the Annual Safety Inspection to remove the old rubber tiles under the swings and replace with wet pour has been completed by a contractor.

Saxon Court

The old wooden and chain-link fences have been removed and have been replaced with powder coated, steel, bow top fencing, Park's staff are due to top up areas around manhole covers with soil and seed.

Equipment

We need to acquire a new backpack sprayer to replace an old one at an approximate cost of no more than £150.00 + VAT.

A failure with the park's Truspred machine has occurred. This piece of equipment is an essential tool in the autumn reparations to the Bowls Green and Cricket Square and we are looking into the possibility of repair or, if necessary, replacement at around £900.00 + VAT.

Staff

Employee 63 successfully completed his probationary period on 7 May 2017 and Chemical Spraying training is now being arranged for him to complete. This will obviously enhance the amount of work able to be undertaken and help spread the load amongst the parks team.






