









Dangerous or anti-social parking issues at Ingress Park

Hello Graham,

There has been a lot of "Facebook Traffic" recently regarding the above. I sent the response shown below to residents this morning. Please can this issue be included as an agenda item for the ASB meeting on 27th January.

Peter Harman Peter Harman Sorry Shaun, message "sent itself" before I had finished typing. I have had my attention drawn to recent comments that you have made Shaun regarding myself and other Councillors; and I would like to take the opportunity to clarify matters. I know that the powers you have as a Police Officer in the Metropolitan Police are different to Kent Police; who inform me that the relevant offences available here are "obstruction" and "dangerous parking". I have checked the Police database and in the last three months there has been ONLY ONE REPORT from residents logged for Ingress Park regarding obstruction, dangerous parking, or abandoned vehicles. That call was made by me for a vehicle parked badly at the second roundabout on Ingress Park Avenue. Therefore it seems to me that yourself, Sacha and other residents who are rightly concerned about dangerous parking are not calling 101 to report these vehicles. I do not think it is therefore reasonable to be blaming Police on this matter when they are not having the vehicles reported to them. Kent Police confirmed that they are making additional patrols in Ingress Park following my previous request; but they stressed that it is essential residents take the time to report these vehicles (rather than just writing about it on Facebook). Therefore, I will conclude by asking all residents at Ingress Park who see a vehicle that they believe is dangerously parked or causing an obstruction to phone 101 straight away. If you are unhappy with the response by Police then please let me know. Also, if any resident wants to meet me and other Councillors on site to discuss these issues I am very happy to come along; just let me know.




