Re: Meeting 7pm, 5<sup>th</sup> April 2017 at Town Hall, Agenda item: Anti-Social and Crime.

I heard about the meeting that will be including the above item on the agenda prompted by the recent attempted burglary at my neighbour's house in Valley View, Greenhithe and wanted to attend, but as I have a work commitment at that time I would not be able to so, so I thought I would write to you with my concerns for your consideration.

The reason I am concerned is that in December 2015 we had a similar attempted burglary, causing a lot of damage to our property a few doors along from the recent incident, we were out, and thankfully, the police were called by our next door neighbour, which disturbed the culprits. The police attended the scene but the

culprits got away, as far as we know no one has been caught for this crime. I am still worried by this and hearing about this recent incident has really disturbed me again.

We have lived in our house for 40 years and most of that time we have felt safe, but we cannot say that now, after what has happened. Something is changing in this area and not for the good, we need to do more to make this area safe again, we have been particularly concerned by the youths loitering at the steps on the alleyway between Valley View and Cobham Terrace which is just along from our back garden and behind the house of the recent incident, although instances of this seem to have been less since some of the shrubs and trees were cut back, we don't think it has stopped. There is no reason for them to be there and we should not have to put up with it!

Crime and anti- social behavior seems to have got worse in the last few years in this area and we were wondering if it had anything to do with what we believe is a 'Bail House' in Cobham Terrace? This must be bringing criminals into our community, it cannot be right for a place such as this to be located in a residential area. I would like to know why local residents were not informed before opening such a place here? I am sure this is part of the problem and believe something needs to be done to remove it out of this residential area to a place more suitable and more remote so as not to cause worry and concerns to the people who live nearby.

I would be grateful if you could keep me informed of any developments on this matter and would be willing to help, if I can, to make this area safe and pleasant to live in again.

'I can confirm there has been a recording error for all of Kent Police's crime figures on the 'police.uk' website for January 2017 which are currently showing incorrectly. Please see below the response from our analyst when we raised your concerns with them.

*"I have reviewed the data that we have sent them as this is correct but it is being misrepresented on their website; almost doubled. Therefore, I have spoken to the Home Office this morning and the problem lies at their end with uploading the data. They are currently reviewing it and will republish the correct data on the maps in due course.*

*As yet, I do not have a time frame, but they have confirmed that the information currently showing on Police.UK for Kent is inaccurate. If you can pass this information on to your council colleagues and any other local enquiries that you may have."*

Once we have accurate figure back onto the system I will let you know.

Sorry for the delay, below is the response from our digital communication department around the rationale not to have PC's advertised on the website, I hope this assists.

*Police Community Support Officers are the main point of contact with the public about community concerns. This is why they feature on our website on the local policing pages, specifically the ward sections.*

*Additionally we provide the name of the Sergeant covering the ward as well as the Inspector.*

*The main purpose of providing named officers in each ward is to provide continuity of contact.*

*Police Constables are deployed to attend and investigate a wide range of issues and incidents in each district according to demand.*

*We have expanded the website to include a contact form to enable the public to submit questions or queries directly to the Community Safety Units. And soon we will have new functionality on our website including Live Chat and Online Crime Reporting. This provides more ways for the public and our communities to get in touch whether it is in relation to community concerns or reporting crime.*
